This study interrogates hybrid funded university facilities' operations and maintenance management. Universities are multidisciplinary structures that encompass a spectrum of services required to ensure effective and efficient academic, administrative, experimental and research focused operations. Universities need sufficient funding as they forecast for maintenance. The research culminated in deriving a tool to simplify the selection of a suitable maintenance budget forecasting model and recommend a maintenance budgeting model for use within universities. This multidisciplinary study contributes to the literature by contextualising the maintenance budget forecasting for universities and in future adding significant value to the proactive management of deferred maintenance in practice.

THE EFFECT OF PUBLIC SPENDING ON ECONOMIC GROWTH, EMPLOYMENT AND POVERTY REDUCTION IN SOUTH AFRICA

This study empirically tested the effect that public spending has on economic growth, employment and poverty reduction in South Africa. The study found that during the post-recession era, expansionary fiscal policy had a positive but minute impact on growth, employment and poverty reduction. ELASTICITY OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN ECONOMY TOWARDS PORTFOLIO INVESTMENTS IN BRICS COUNTRIES

The aim of this study was to determine the elasticity of the South African Economy towards the Portfolio Investment flows amongst BRICS countries. Based on the Augmented Cobb-Douglas Production Function framework, this study used both the Dynamic Panel Generalised Method of Moments (GMM) and VAR estimation techniques. The results of these estimation techniques showed that intra-BRICS FPI flows have a negative and statistically insignificant relationship with economic growth in BRICS countries whilst a positive and statistically significant relationship with respect to Foreign Direct Investments flows. The study recommends that BRICS countries should attend to negative effects of inflationary pressures and also ensure stable political environments whist at the same time attend to enhancing both infrastructure and Human Capital Investment. This study makes an original contribution towards Financial Markets Studies in BRICS economies.

AN ECONOMIC EVALUATION OF THE NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL ADVISORY SERVICES (NAADS) PROGRAMME IN UGANDA

The National Agricultural Advisory Services (NAADS) programme was formed in Uganda in 2001 as a response to previously poor performance of extension services in Uganda. Given the enormous resources injected into the programme since 2001 with poor outcomes, it was important to determine the economic viability of the NAADS. Using a non-probability random sampling technique with the application of a Cost Benefit Analysis and the Principal Component Analysis, on a sample size of 384 participants, the findings suggest that the NAADS programme is not an economically viable programme due to a number of constraints. In order to make the NAADS programme economically viable, the study recommends that access to agricultural finance should be extended. Farmers' Associations should be promoted. Intermediary technology and effective soil management techniques should also be introduced amongst the farmers in Uganda.
