The aim of this study was to assess the integration of the New BRICS Development Bank into the global financial architecture. Using a panel data (RE) and Quintile Regressive Models the results show that the World Bank and the IMF loans had a negative effect on African countries during the period under review. This study recommends that the NDB should play a complimentary role in the international financial space and champion the "post ideological rhetoric" era. This thesis makes an original contribution towards International Finance in that it is for the first time that lending models for the NDB have been devised through use of econometric models.

DETECTION OF EARLY WARNING SIGNS OF CURRENCY CRISES IN SOUTH AFRICA

South Africa, the economic powerhouse of Africa should be more susceptible to currency crises based on having a floating exchange rate regime in the light of increased financial integration and capital mobility. However, South Africa's foreign exchange market is characterised as volatile by previous and reoccurring turbulent periods of currency crises observed in 1996, 1998, 2001 and 2008. South Africa has no specific tool adequately tested and developed to accurately detect such an event before its occurrence. This research attempts to fill this gap. The thesis examines and makes use of Early Warning System models to find out which one best identifies possible early warning signals of currency crises in South Africa. The study employs two of these models namely, the Signal and the Probit models. Other two newer Early Warning System models are also employed namely, the Markov Regime Switching model and the Artificial Neural Networks model that has not yet been applied in the South African context for the probability prediction of currency crises. The findings suggest that, the Artificial Neural Network is a powerful tool in the probability prediction of currency crises early warning signs in South Africa.

SOUTH AFRICA'S EXPORTS TO ZIMBABWE: A GRAVITY MODEL ANALYSIS

The study analyses South Africa's exports to Zimbabwe. Gravity model estimations show that distance and exchange rate retard exports while the population of South Africa and the gross domestic product of the importing country boost them. The speed of convergence tests indicate that there is untapped potential for South Africa's exports in Zimbabwe for many product categories including textiles, animal products and ceramic articles. To harness the unrealized potential for the symbiotic benefit of the two nations, the study makes several policy recommendations, including implementation of one stop border control point and negotiation of more favorable bilateral trade agreements.

MICROFINANCE AND POVERTY ALLEVIATION IN UGANDA

The aim of this study was to assess the impact of microfinance on poverty in Uganda. The study used both qualitative and quantitative research methodologies. Using a principal component analysis, analysis of variance techniques and probit regression models; the results show that; notwithstanding some constraints in this sector; microfinance plays a significant role in poverty alleviation in Uganda. The study recommends increased levels of the microfinance institution (MFI) outreach programmes; low interest rates, promotion of household savings and increased monitoring and supervision of the MFI clients.
